Tisha B' Av - Sad Emoji 😥




Yom Kippur - Angel Emoji 🧰

ACTIVITY 4 THE KOTEL IS A GIFT

Create a Kotel using a shoe box or cardboard

Materials needed: Shoe box/Cardboard, scissors, glue, coloured pencils/paint, ribbon, gift wrap



Step 1: Find a shoebox



Step 2: Cut the lid off and cut all the sides so it opens



Step 3: Cut a rectangle from scrap cardboard



Step 4: Colour/Paint/Print the Kotel onto a piece of paper and stick it onto the rectangle



Step 5: Glue your Kotel to the middle of the box and let dry



Step 6: Decorate your box, tie a ribbon around the box to hold it together.

Step 7: Appreciate the special gift that Hashem gave to us!
